Students who have not received housing assignments should report to the Burleigh Hall Conference Room located on the 1st floor. You will receive further instructions at that time.



Please bring all belongings to set up your room and begin the semester. As a reminder, our campus is undergoing several exciting construction projects such as the building of a new 400-bed residence hall. We ask that you are patient and follow all move-in, traveling, and parking instructions so as to insure a safe and successful move-in process.
